A Change In Numbers

Reminder: On October 24, 2021, callers in New Hampshire will be required to dial the 3-digit area code, 603, when making local calls. This change is to help prepare for July 2022 and the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline, 988. Why? "988" happens to be the area code or local exchange in many states, including New Hampshire.

Just as someone in need can call "911" for help, as of July 16, 2022, those in crisis can now dial "988" and be connected to the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline immediately. The current number is 1-800-273-TALK (1-800-273-8255).

Please remember to change all programmed speed dials on home and business systems, as well as contacts in mobile devices. Each phone number should be 10 digits, which includes the "603" area code for New Hampshire numbers.

The Town of East Kingston will have its eWaste/White Goods pickup on October 18, 2021. Due to the COVID-19 Delta Variant, the process has changed from that stated in the 2021-2022 Waste Management Flyer.

The sticker sales for the eWaste/White Goods will take place in the Town Offices parking lot Saturday, October 9, 2021 from 10 AM to 1 PM.

In the event of rain, the sales will take place in the Town Offices 2nd floor hallway.

Stickers may be purchased with either cash or check for \$20 each. No credit cards will be accepted. Items to be picked up must have a visible sticker attached or it will not be picked up. See the

A Bounty of Farms & Pastures in East Kingston

Our rural character in East Kingston is a major contributor to quality of life. Our farm and pasture lands contribute significantly to this character. Much of our farmland—such as the expansive fields of **the Bodwell Farms**; the horses, stables, and pastures of **Turning Point** and **Kenridge Farms**; and the well-known **Monahan Farm** where the public can pick their own fruits and vegetables in season—are visible from the road.

Monahan Farm is a berry and vegetable farm in East Kingston which will continue to be farmed and a local source of food, thanks to a conservation effort with the Southeast Land Trust of NH (SELT).

More hidden from view but equally important and beautiful are such properties as the 169-acre **Kingswood Farm**, an elite equine boarding and training facility, or **the Hidden Hollow Farm** where Dennis Perkins Sr. boards horses, raises livestock and hays many of our fields.

Up the quiet Sanborn Road is the **Smith Farm** where fruits and vegetables are sold.

Off Giles Road, Dr. Marston and his wife Debbie run the **Ilneva Farm** (pronounced "he'll never" have a farm!) where they raise livestock. In a recent count they had 60 goats, 8 pigs, 45 sheep, 25 cows and 18 equines. In addition to having run the farm for over 40 years and being the town's animal officer, Dr. Marston also serves on the East Kingston Town Planning Board (member since 1975).

Richard Gordon has 3 acres of blueberry bushes off Burnt Swamp Road.

Some farm properties are smaller in size and may be found by spotting a farm stand or sign while driving around East Kingston. In fact, if you drive west on Depot Road from Monahan's you will see signs and stands for blueberries, eggs, honey, vegetables and rabbits!

Bonnie McLaughlin has been raising rabbits for over 40 years (she may have up to 200 of them at a given time) and has additionally been very active in 4-H programs.

East Kingston also has other agricultural activities, such as the **Windcrest Farm** (Christmas trees) and the **Willow Sugar House** (Maple Syrup). Julie Ostopchuk sells botanical products via **Pisces Naturals**; many of the herbs used in Julie's products are grown on her organic farm, or are sustainably wild-harvested. Julie has studied herbalism for 30 years and is an active member of the East Kingston Conservation Commission.

There are more... A number of agricultural businesses may have websites – others may require a bit of digging (pun intended?). Some former or existing businesses may have modified their public facing methods due to Covid-19. We should continue to support these valuable businesses...get out there and check 'em out!
