Pollinator Pathways NH will hold its 5th annual Seed Swap/Giveaway Extravaganza on Sat., November 11, from 9am-2pm. at the Kingston Recreation Center, 24 Main Street in Kingston. As always, there will be dozens of hand-gathered native plant species. If you have seed to swap, please label it and bring a photograph of the plant to display with the seed.

Doors open at 9 a.m. Be aware that many species "sell out" fast. The later you come, the more limited the selection will be.

In past years they've offered seed from more than 30 species of native perennials and shrubs. Homemade refreshments, tea and coffee will be on hand, along with informational hand-outs, and some fun raffles.


