Bulk Waste Stickers

by Ron Morales, Solid Waste Removal and Recycle Committee Bulk Waste pickup day is May 13th. It requires a sticker system. Each household will be allowed 2 free stickers and may purchase additional stickers for \$20 each. They must be picked up at the Town Clerks Office (603) 642-8406 Option #2.

As a reminder, the Town Offices will be closed during the week of May 6th to accommodate the wood floor refinishing schedule. We appreciate your patience during this time. Because this is the week prior to bulk pickup, we are asking that you make arrangements to get them now. Each item requires a sticker be affixed to it and needs to be curbside prior to 7am Monday, May 13th.

The last day to pick up bulk stickers is Friday, May 3rd, before 2:30pm.

East Kingston 2024-25 Kindergarten Registration

East Kingston Elementary School is currently registering kindergarten students for the 24-25 school year. Students must be five years old on or before September 30, 2024 (DOB 10/1/18 through 9/30/19) and be a resident of East Kingston.

To obtain a registration packet, please call the school (603)642-3511 or email Karen Hoffmaster <u>khoffmaster@sau16.org</u>. Registration packets can also be found on our East Kingston School website <u>eks.sau16.org</u>. **There will be a kindergarten orientation for parents held on May 9th at 5:00pm at the school**.

All materials required are listed in the packet. You may register your child by returning all required paperwork to the school office between the hours of 8am-4pm. Our mailing address is 5 Andrews Lane, East Kingston, NH 03927.

New Hampshire State Law requires all children to have had immunizations for DPT, polio, mumps, measles, German measles, chickenpox and hepatitis B prior to entering school. A complete medical exam, taken within one year of entry into kindergarten is also required. You will also need your child's birth certificate and proof of residency to complete the registration process.


Come Paddle with us on the Powwow!

Several members of your East Kingston Conservation Commission (EKCC) will be paddling on the Powwow Pond on Saturday, May 25th, 2024 from 10AM-noon (rain date Saturday, June 1st, 2024) and we'd love it if any East Kingston kayakers/canoeists would like to join us! We plan to leave from the boat launch on Kelley Lane (see map) and be on the water for about two hours of "relaxed" paddling. The parking lot will accommodate about 10 cars and is for EK residents only, with stickers. The 2024 Town Beach and Boat Launch stickers are available at the Town Clerk's Office. Each household is entitled to 2 free stickers for Town Resident vehicles; they are \$10.00 for each additional.

We will paddle under the railroad trestle and view the EK public beach and then continue down towards the Tricklin' Falls dam. Time permitting, we'll also go along a portion of the Kingston shoreline. EKCC members will share information on local flora, including the invasive milfoil. and speak briefly about the importance of the Powwow and plans to address the town beach erosion. This is intended to be a fun trip to acquaint, or reacquaint, you with a wonderful spot and provide some information – not a lecture!




